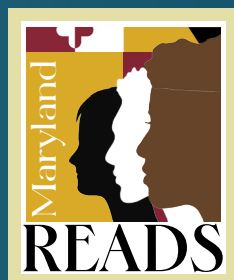

Executive Summary

Maryland has made a historic investment in community schools under the Blueprint for Maryland's Future, rapidly expanding the model statewide to address barriers that keep students from learning. Early indicators show progress—particularly improved attendance—confirming that community schools are helping stabilize students and families.

This is important progress. The question now is whether this investment is on track to produce the academic results it was designed to deliver. Community schools address barriers to learning. Literacy coaches ensure learning actually happens. Coaching is the missing link that turns improved conditions into reading gains.

Under the Blueprint, Maryland dramatically expanded community schools from 193 to 713 schools from 2020 - 2026.

50% of Maryland schools are now operating as community schools.

The data show mixed results – 408 schools (57.14%) saw increases in reading proficiency. 244 schools (34.17%) saw declining proficiency rates. There is no consistent relationship between the year of community school designation and the direction or magnitude of changes in reading proficiency.

- Designation as a community school alone does not predict academic improvement. What matters is how the model is implemented and whether strong instructional practices are in place.
- Attendance is improving in community schools, confirming that the model is working as intended to stabilize students and families. However, attendance is a leading indicator—not the end goal. **Reading proficiency is the essential academic outcome that must follow.**
- Until now, Maryland lacked a public and comprehensive statewide analysis of reading outcomes in community schools to help state leaders understand the importance of reading coaches in classrooms to support teachers.
- Community schools address barriers to learning but dedicated literacy coaches are needed to ensure schools achieve the consistent and sustained improvement in reading proficiency we know is possible.
- **Without a statewide literacy coaching program, Maryland risks leaving the instructional return on its community school investment unrealized.** Coaching is the missing link that turns improved conditions into reading gains.

Maryland's Historic Investment—and the Results It Must Deliver

The concept of community schools is not new. As early as the 1900s, John Dewey envisioned schools as social centers¹ — places where academic learning is strengthened by strong connections to families, health services, and community life. That vision became more formalized in the 1970s, when nonprofit organizations and the federal government began intentionally coordinating wraparound supports for students facing both academic and non-academic barriers to success.²

Maryland has long been part of this movement. Congressman Steny Hoyer was a national champion of community schools, and Maryland's early investments—particularly in Baltimore City—demonstrated the potential of the model to improve student engagement and school stability.³

In 2019, the General Assembly took an important step by establishing the Concentration of Poverty School Grant Program, laying the groundwork for community schools statewide. Two

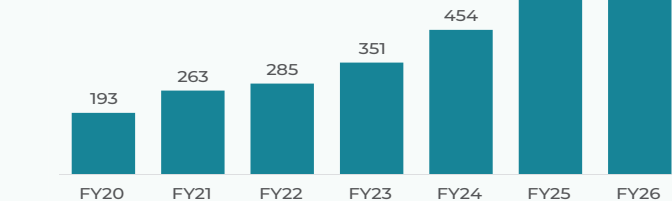
years later, Maryland made a historic commitment through the Blueprint for Maryland's Future Act, transforming community schools from isolated initiatives into a statewide strategy.⁴

As a result, Maryland's community school network expanded from 193 schools in 2020 to 713 schools by 2026,⁵ backed by approximately \$649 million in state investment through personnel and per-pupil grants. These schools now provide coordinated health services, expanded learning opportunities, family engagement, and community partnerships — particularly for students living in poverty.⁶

This investment was bold. It was necessary. And now, it is poised to deliver results.

Community School Expansion

What Community Schools Are Designed to Do

The National Center for Community Schools has been clear. “The primary focus of community schools is promoting children’s educational success.”²

Maryland READS strongly agrees. And we believe a defining indicator of whether schools are succeeding academically is reading proficiency.

The primary focus of community schools is promoting children’s educational success.

Reading proficiency is not simply one outcome among many. It is the gateway skill that determines whether students can access all other learning—across subjects, grade levels, and life pathways. If community schools are working as intended, improvements in reading proficiency should be an expected result of the investment.

The state invested in community schools to put students in a position to achieve reading proficiency. But for that to happen, schools must be equipped not only with wraparound supports, but also with high-quality, evidence-based literacy instruction.

Why Reading Proficiency Must Be a Success Measure

Community schools are explicitly designed to remove barriers to learning—chronic absenteeism, unmet health needs, family instability, and lack of enrichment opportunities. These critical investments create the conditions for learning.

However, conditions alone do not teach children to read.

Reading proficiency improves when strong instructional practices—grounded in the Science of Reading—are consistently implemented in classrooms. That is why reading outcomes are a lagging indicator when it comes to community school data:

they come after attendance improves, trust is built, and students are consistently present and ready to learn.

Maryland is already moving in the right direction. All 24 districts have developed comprehensive, K–12 literacy plans aligned with the Science of Reading. The remaining question is how effectively those plans are implemented and supported—especially in schools serving students with the greatest needs.

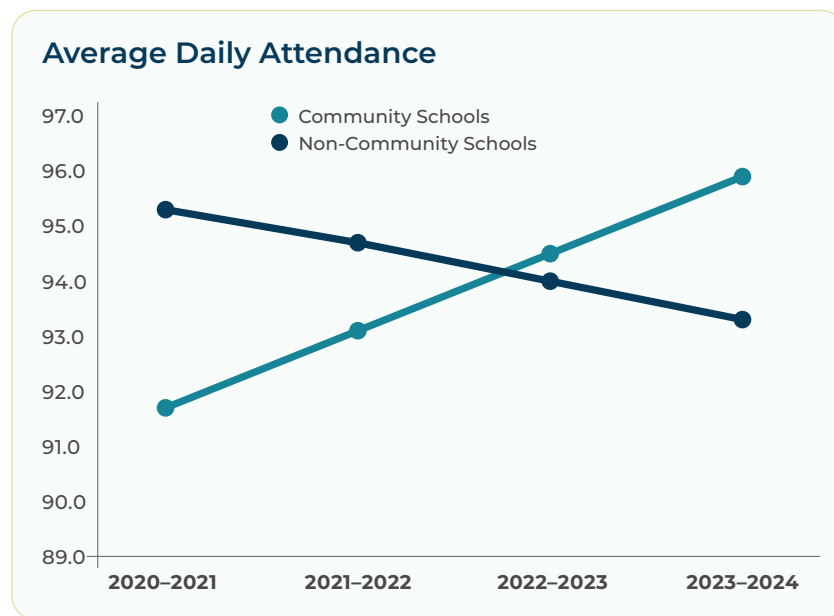
Gains in reading come after attendance improves, trust is built, and students are consistently present and ready to learn.

The Early Data Tells us Momentum is Building. Attendance is Consistently Improving.

One of the clearest early signals that community schools in Maryland are working is attendance.

Chronic absenteeism—defined as missing 10% or more of the school year—remains a statewide challenge, particularly post-pandemic.⁸ But research consistently shows that community schools outperform comparable non-community schools on attendance measures.⁹

- National studies, including work from New York,¹⁰ identify reductions in absenteeism as one of the earliest impacts of effective community school implementation.
- In Maryland, a recent Towson University report found that students' average daily attendance in community schools improves with each additional year the model is in place—and that community schools experience lower absenteeism than predicted, even as non-community schools have seen worsening trends.¹¹



This matters because attendance is a leading indicator. Reading proficiency follows only when students are present consistently enough to benefit from instruction.

Why Coaching Is the Missing Instructional Link

Here is the critical point:

**Community schools address barriers to learning.
Literacy coaches ensure learning actually happens.**

Investing in a statewide literacy coaching program allows the investment in community schools to fully pay off.

Research shows¹² that protected, well-supported literacy coaches are among the most effective tools for improving classroom instruction—especially when aligned to the Science of Reading. States that have invested in coaching have seen rapid gains. Most recently, Georgia reported a 15 percentage point increase in reading proficiency after placing full-time coaches in its lowest-performing schools for just one year.¹³

Community schools and statewide coaching are complementary investments. One creates the conditions for learning; the other ensures instructional effectiveness. Combined together, we can end the reading crisis for students - especially for those facing the largest academic and non-academic barriers to success.

A statewide coaching model ensures

- Coaches are protected from being pulled into non-instructional roles
- Support is targeted to schools with the greatest needs, including community schools
- Evidence-based practices are implemented with fidelity and consistency

Turning Investment Into Impact

Maryland has made a strategic and historic investment in community schools. Early indicators—particularly improved attendance—show that the strategy is working as intended.

Now, the state must complete the theory of change.

Reading proficiency should be a clear, expected outcome of community school investment—but only if schools are also supported with the instructional capacity to deliver results. A statewide literacy coaching program strengthens community schools, accelerates return on investment, and ensures that Maryland’s most vulnerable students gain the foundational skill they need to succeed.

Examining Reading Proficiency in Maryland's Community Schools

Maryland's historic investment in community schools reflects a commitment to addressing the full range of factors that influence student success. By expanding access to health services, family supports, and community partnerships, community schools are designed to create the conditions students need to engage consistently in learning.

As Maryland READS began examining the rapid growth of community schools statewide, we identified an important opportunity: while implementation and early indicators such as attendance and engagement have been closely monitored, there has been no comprehensive, statewide analysis of academic outcomes within community schools—particularly reading proficiency.

Reading proficiency is a critical measure of student success and underpins learning across all subject areas.

This gap is understandable. Community schools have rightly emphasized student well-being, stability, and access to services, especially in communities facing significant challenges. These supports are essential and foundational. At the same time, as the community school strategy matures and scales, it is both appropriate and necessary to examine how these investments translate into academic outcomes.

Reading proficiency is a critical measure of student success. Literacy underpins learning across all subject areas and is strongly associated with long-term educational and economic outcomes. Understanding how reading proficiency is changing within community schools allows educators, policymakers, and communities to better assess progress and identify opportunities for improvement.

For this reason, **Maryland READS undertook a county-by-county, school-by-school analysis of reading proficiency trends in Maryland's community schools.** This analysis is not intended to evaluate the community school model in isolation, but rather to provide greater transparency into academic outcomes as part of a broader, holistic approach to student success.

As attendance and engagement—key early indicators of effective community school implementation—continue to improve, we expect to see corresponding gains in reading proficiency over time. The data that follows invites reflection: What trends are emerging in your community? Where are gains occurring, and where do challenges remain? What additional supports might accelerate progress?

Maryland READS believes that strengthening academic outcomes within community schools requires pairing wraparound supports with evidence-based instructional practices. That is why we are working to elevate the role of a statewide literacy coaching program as a complementary investment—one that builds on the foundation community schools provide and helps ensure that improved conditions for learning result in measurable gains in reading proficiency.

From Investment to Impact

Maryland’s commitment to community schools reflects a bold and necessary strategy to address the complex barriers facing students living in poverty. Early indicators—particularly improvements in attendance—demonstrate that the model is working to create the conditions for learning.

But conditions alone are not enough.

If community schools are to fulfill their promise, reading proficiency must be treated as a clear, expected outcome of the investment. As our review of the data shows, academic gains will not occur automatically. They require intentional alignment between wraparound supports and high-quality, evidence-based instruction grounded in the Science of Reading.

To ensure that Maryland’s historic investment delivers meaningful academic results, Maryland READS recommends the following actions:

Reading proficiency must be treated as a clear, expected outcome of the investment in community schools.

Policy and Practice Recommendations

- Make reading proficiency a core success measure of community school implementation, alongside attendance, engagement, and well-being.
- Invest in a statewide literacy coaching program that prioritizes community schools and other high-need settings to strengthen instructional practice.
- Protect literacy coaches from non-instructional duties so coaching remains focused on improving classroom instruction and student outcomes.
- Target coaching resources strategically to schools with the greatest academic and non-academic needs to maximize return on investment.
- Align community school funding, district literacy plans, and coaching supports to ensure consistent implementation of the Science of Reading across classrooms.
- Commit to transparent, ongoing analysis of academic outcomes within community schools to inform continuous improvement and policy decisions.

Finding the Story in Charts and Data Tables

Throughout 2025, the team at Maryland READS sought to better understand how community schools are being evaluated in Maryland and whether the significant public investment in this strategy is translating into improvements in student reading outcomes.

The charts that follow are designed to help readers understand reading outcomes in Maryland's community schools at multiple levels—from statewide patterns to individual school performance.

The first set of charts presents pie charts illustrating reading proficiency rates for fourth-grade students, providing a visual snapshot of how students are performing relative to proficiency benchmarks.

The second set of charts summarizes reading proficiency rates for community schools at the district level, grouped by elementary, middle, and high school levels. These charts help readers understand broader trends across school systems.

The final set of charts provides a school-by-school breakdown of reading proficiency rates within each district, again organized by elementary, middle, and high school levels, allowing for a closer examination of individual community schools.

Our Approach

This analysis focuses on community schools that were operational during the 2024–2025 school year.

Changes in reading proficiency rates are based on an examination of Maryland Comprehensive Assessment Program (MCAP) reading data from 2022 and 2025. Because schools were designated as community schools in different years, this report also identifies the year each school began operating as a community school.

Schools that will begin operating as community schools in the 2025–2026 school year are listed separately at the end of the report.

Data Sources

Community School Designations: The list of community schools included in this report was obtained from the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) [**Office of Community Schools and Expanded Learning Time**](#). The year each school was designated as a community school was confirmed with MSDE.

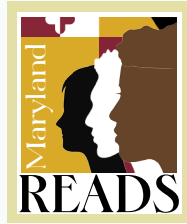
